A Note from Mr. Calvert

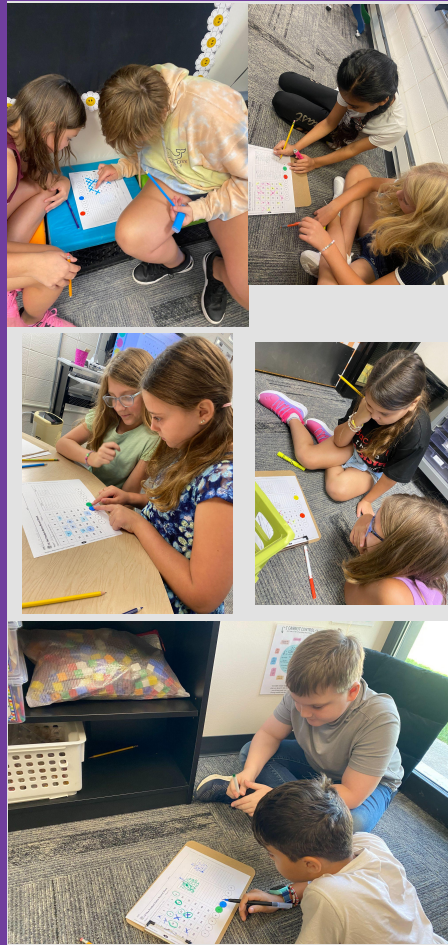

SCHOOL NURSES WE CARE FOR YOUR KIDS

Notes from our Nurses:

It's that time of year when we start to see an increase in illnesses entering our school. Here is a review of the WCV Health Policy:

FEVER: Students must be fever free [without medication] for 24 hours before returning to school. A fever is 100.3 F or above.

VOMITING: Students must NOT have vomited for 24 hours before returning to school.

PINK EYE: Students can return to school one prescription eye drops have been started.

STREP THROAT: Students must have an antibiotic for at least 24 hours before returning to school.

COUGH/COLD: Students can remain at school with mild cough/cold symptoms. If the cough is continual, or becoming a distraction in class, the nurse will be consulted. If your child is going to require multiple cough drops throughout the day, please send them to school with your student. Your student's classroom teacher can keep them on their desk.

WCV will be following Guthrie County Public Health COVID recommendations. If your student tests positive for COVID, they will need to stay home for five days and can return on day six if symptoms are improving, and they are fever free 24 hours without medications. On day 6-10, it is recommended that a mask is worn.

Other students exposed in the household are recommended to monitor for symptoms for 10 days. They are still able to attend school if they are symptom free. If symptoms develop. GCPH recommends being tested. In the event of a positive test, please contact GCPH.

Arrival/Dismissal Reminders

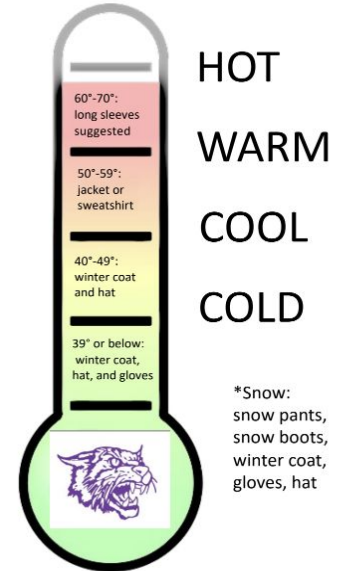
Please notify the office of any changes to your child's arrival or dismissal plans. Student Safety is our top priority, and we appreciate all communication that helps us ensure student safety.
